



Colon and rectal cancer has traditionally been a disease of older adults. As a matter of fact, the majority of cases of colorectal cancer (CRC) is diagnosed in people over 60 years of age. Luckily, the rate of CRC in people over 50 years old has been going down steadily over the past several decades. This trend is thought to be due to increased screening and awareness of symptoms.

Unfortunately, the rate of CRC is going in the opposite direction in younger people. What's even more alarming is that CRC in young adults tends to be more advanced at the time of diagnosis. The cancer is oftentimes more aggressive, as well, meaning that it can have a worse outcome.

Doctor's have worked to figure out why this disturbing trend is happening. A recent study published in the medical journal, Nature, found a new characteristic of CRC in young people that isn't seen frequently in cancers of people over 70.


24th Annual - 24 Hours of Booty


This year's event has raised over \$1.7 million!
